COMMUNITY SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR – Mary D D'Alessio

In 1849 while pastoring his congregation in Wayland, MA, Unitarian parish minister Edmund Hamilton Sears crafted a poem entitled "It Came Upon the Midnight Clear." The next year at his request, it was set to music by New York organist, Richard Storrs Willis. The words penned by Rev. Sears, a pacifist and champion in the battle against slavery, still beckon us to remember that the world in which we live, the world we see, is mysteriously "shot through" by the eternal world unseen, and our gracious heavenly King still desires peace for us.

For well over a century and a half, "It Came Upon the Midnight Clear," along with many other carols—"O Come, All Ye Faithful," "Joy to the World", "O Little Town of Bethlehem", have been sung in churches by choirs and congregations, in living rooms by families gathered 'round a piano, in nursing homes and hospital hallways and on the lawns of shutins by visiting friends who lift up Christmas songs of good cheer.

This year, 2020, is oh so different, for our desire to spread joy has been usurped by our desire NOT to spread that nasty virus. So, we

hide our smiles behind masks. We hush our glorious songs of joy all the while yearning for times of warm fellowship.

My dear, Christian friends, I suggest there is no better time than the "NOW" in which we live to reflect and absorb the words of Sears' carol. The angels still sing. Be still. Be quiet. Believe and listen.

(The following are Sears' words, copied from a likeness of his hand penned poem as displayed in the Wayland Museum in Massachusetts.)

"It Came Upon the Midnight Clear"

It came upon the midnight clear, that glorious song of old, from angels bending near the Earth to touch their harps of gold; "Peace on the Earth, good will to men from heaven's all gracious King" -- the world in solemn stillness lay to hear the angels sing.

Still through the cloven skies they come with peaceful wings unfurled, and still their heavenly music floats o'er all the weary world; above its sad and lowly plains they bend on hovering wing and ever o'er its Babel sounds the blessed angels sing.

But with the woes of sin and strife the world has suffered long; beneath the angel strain have rolled two thousand years of wrong; and man, at war with man, hears not the love-song which they bring--O hush the noise ye men of strife and hear the angels sing!

And ye beneath life's crushing load, whose forms are bending low, we toil along the climbing way with painful steps and slow.

Look now! for glad and golden hours come swiftly on the wing;-
O rest beside the weary road and hear the angels sing!

For lo! the days are hastening on by prophet bards foretold, when with the ever-circling years comes round the age of gold; when peace shall over all the earth

its ancient splendors fling, and the whole world give back the song which now the angels sing.
