## COMMUNITY SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR – Mary D D'Alessio

Take a look at your calendar and note that Easter is coming! Sunday, April 4 will be the big day when we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. I don't know about you, but I'm ready to celebrate—joy and life winning out over despair and death! I'm ready and I would wager that you are, too. But before we can get to the celebration, we have a journey ahead of us, a journey with Jesus, a journey toward Jerusalem and the cross. We still have much to learn as we travel, following him. All four gospels recount Jesus' final days as he resolutely turns his face to Jerusalem, but I particularly like John's account with its unique perspectives and nuances. The first three verses of John, chapter 12 say this: "Six days before the Passover Jesus came to Bethany, the home of Lazarus, whom he had raise from the dead.<sup>2</sup> There they gave a dinner for him. Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at the table with him.<sup>3</sup> Mary took a pound of costly perfume made of pure nard, anointed Jesus' feet, and wiped them with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume." Those verses are dear to me because they remind me of gentler days. My husband Dave and I lived in Cambridge, England in the late 1980's to study as exchange students at a theological college. Our flat (apartment) was one of three crammed into a small space in the attic of the college president's home. Often, we

joined other students in Ruth and Andrew's flat which was next door to ours. We'd all squeeze into their tiny lounge (living room) to read scripture, pray, share and sing. Because we gathered to fellowship it didn't matter that the furniture was sparse, the carpet threadbare, and the room drafty. I remember the night we first sang May the Fragrance of Jesus Fill This Place, a song written by Graham Kendrick who'd also given the Church Shine Jesus Shine and Knowing You Jesus. I remember that night because something mystical happened. As we joined our voices in song, the small attic apartment became holy, for the fragrance of Jesus, the fragrance of Jesus filled that little lounge, filled us, filled me! Love came down and Jesus blessed us with the knowledge of his presence.

To powerfully be reminded that Jesus is with us—well, it's an extraordinary gift, isn't it? That night his presence was experienced as a sweet, sweet fragrance, surely surpassing that of the costly perfume Mary poured over Jesus' feet and spread with her hair as an act of extraordinary love.

Truth be told, I yearn for such miraculous moments—moments when the presence of Jesus startles me, moments akin to those many of us shared as we walked the road to Emmaus, moments that can lift us into a place of blessed assurance, assurance that Jesus IS with us, always with us, moments when our full attention is turned to Jesus

so we, like Mary, can extravagantly and unashamedly pour out our priceless love for him.

As you and I head toward Easter, I encourage us all to embrace the journey, and to journey well as a testament to our devotion to our Lord, remembering that we, who call ourselves disciples, do not travel alone. Think on these words from Hebrews, chapter 12 so that you might steer clear of discouragement and fear: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such hostility against himself from sinners, so that you may not grow weary or lose heart." In Christ's love,

## KAIROS – Tom Patterson

Brothers and sisters - unfortunately we are still locked out of the prison system. As of Feb 24th, there are zero active inmate Covid cases and 12 active employee cases. The recent blizzard conditions created another horrible situation for our brothers in the Torres unit. The buildings and cells are not energy efficient or properly heated. The inmates were not issued any additional blankets or clothing. With temperatures dropping into the single digits, the inmates struggled to stay warm. I also heard there has been an outbreak of violence inside. Please pray for all those incarcerated to feel God's love and for Kairos to have the ability to get back inside the Torres unit.
