

Call to Order and Opening Prayer

Hal called the meeting to order Larry Bader opened the meeting in prayer

Discussion and acceptance of the prior month's minutes

The Board of Directors did not meet in May – instead we hosted a Pot Luck Meal for Walk #63. No minutes to be approved

Discussion and acceptance of the prior month's financial report

Regarding the Men's Walk #63 held in April – several pilgrims dropped from the walk at the last minute – Chris was seeking approval to reimburse the team fees to them. Carol Wilson made a motion to accept the financials as presented

Discussion regarding Men's Walk #65

- Walk Coordinator, Ginny Stricklin reported that John Decker has completed all requirements of a Walk Lay Director and has expressed his desire to be the Lay Director for Men's Walk #65 in April of 2024.
- Ginny Stricklin made the motion to approve John Decker as Lay Director Bill Walker 2nd the motion – motion passed
- Ginny also reported that Dwane Brown, the previous Lay Director of Men's Walk #63 has been asked to serve as Board Rep for Men's Walk #64 and has agreed to serve in this position upon Board Approval
- Ginny Stricklin made the motion to approve Dwane Brown as Board Rep. Bill Walker 2nd the motion – motion passed.

Discussion regarding Men's Walk #65 – April, 2024

Ginny advised that she, John Decker & Dwane Brown have visited the Omega Center – the entire center has been completely remodeled since we looked at it last - we should be able to use the facilities just as we have in the past with "better amenities". They were also told that the Omega Center has hired a new chef.

Omega Center: Cost per person - \$200.00 with no additional fees for additional buildings. Camp Capers: Cost per person - \$285.00 plus additional fees for additional buildings.

Omega Center has been booked for April $4^{\text{th}} - 7^{\text{th}}$, 2024 with a \$400.00 deposit. Camp Capers deposit was considerably more expensive.

The Women's Walk has been booked for September $19^{th} - 22^{nd} 2024$.

Discussion regarding the postponement of Women's Walk #64

- Hal opened the discussion with the phrase of not wanting to "wear a hair shirt" "to behave in a way that shows you feel very sorry and guilty about something you have done wrong." There is an underlying current of discord running through our community and we need to be concerned. We as a Board need to lead the community to a fix heal from the inside we are not to do God's work we need to leave space for the Holy Spirit to work.
- The first 3 days of the creation God created "space" days 4 thru 6 God filled that space then He rested.

Speaking directly to Denise Vadnais – Hal wanted her to know that she is not a failure!

Hal opened the discussion to the Board asking for ideas . . .

Carol Wilson – Amen to Hal's comment

- Larry Bader spoke of individual engagement we need to take the Walk to Emmaus into our personal church homes inviting members to a Walk deepen individual relationships leading others to involvement.
- Carol Wilson First United Methodist Church is building a data base of Walks that our Community has sponsored. We are still struggling from the COVID pandemic and bringing people back to church and involvement.
- Geri Willis presented the question "How do I approach my pastor?"
- Dory Martinez echoed the thoughts others had mentioned our Community has become lax pushing the idea of using what you learned on your walk (don't forget about the Boerne Community)
- Larry Bader include a card with instructions / steps explaining to Pilgrims where and how to connect with Communities and Reunion Groups in the closing package.

Chris Hornburg - look into how we can re-emphasize this information into Sunday's Schedule

- Bill Walker Reunion Groups some have become "clicks" (not open to taking in new members) or have disbanded without our knowledge. He will be looking into / contacting Reunion Groups that we have information on. Encouragement of leading / test drive a small group.
- Hal Hornburg The idea of Reunion Groups need to grow & divide. Reminder that The Upper Room Information that we have is a wonderful outline of how the Walk to Emmaus works – but is not the Bible – we need to be flexible.
- Ginny Strickland we need to train sponsors to continue to bring their pilgrims to the Gatherings and help them get connected. Larry Bader reminded her that he has been training the Sponsors at the last several Walks.
- Dale Schweers he feels frustrated everyone has an excuse we need to figure out the why where are your priorities? The Walk is about RE-prioritization of life.
- Casey Purvis underlined the involvement / follow-up by sponsors
- Hal Hornburg mentioned that Zoom hurt Emmaus and our Churches it became too easy to stay home and watch the Zoom services We have an email list of 300+ email contacts how can we reach them.

Larry Bader – we can take that list of emails – split it up among the board and make phone calls
